Lenten Retreat for the Lakewood/Cleveland Cluster: The next retreat will be held on Wed., March 3rd, at St. Luke Church at 1212 Bunts Rd. This evening will include a brief review of the first week and an in-depth look at the Elder Son. It is probably obvious to most of us when we have experienced those times in our lives like the “prodigal” son and have moved away from God or our families; but, isn’t the reaction of the Elder Son in the story perfectly understandable? After all, “all these years I have slaved for you and never once disobeyed any orders of yours,” certainly I have done nothing wrong. As so often is true in the Gospel stories, Jesus is talking to both the “sinners and tax collectors” and the “Pharisees and scribes” in the story of the Prodigal Son. In order to determine our greatest need for Reconciliation, we must be able to see which characters are more like us. The remaining weeks of our retreat will be aimed at helping to identify this and prepare us for the Penance Service on Wed., March 24th, at St. Clement Church.
